

EMERGENCY ORDINANCE NO. 2020-11

AN ORDINANCE EXTENDING THE DEADLINE FOR THE FILING OF AND PAYMENTS OF THE CITY OF MONROE INCOME TAX FOR FILING YEAR 2019 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Federal Government has extended the deadline for the filing and payment of Federal income tax for filing year 2019 to July 15, 2020

WHEREAS, due to the declaration of a state of emergency by the Governor of the State of Ohio and the National Emergency declared by the President of the United States, Council deems it in the best interest of the residents to extend the deadline for the filing of and payments of the City of Monroe income tax for filing year 2019.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MONROE, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

SECTION 1: The Council of the City of Monroe hereby extends the deadline for the filing of and payments of the City of Monroe Income Tax for filing year 2019 to July 15, 2020.

SECTION 2: Council further, through the adoption of this ordinance, shall have the filing deadline extended automatically extended to remain within the same guidelines as the Federal Government. This automatic extension shall also apply to the due date for payments should the Federal Government change this date to be effective after July 15, 2020.

SECTION 3: This measure is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare and further for the reason that Council recognizes the financial hardship that the COVID-19 pandemic has had on its residents. Therefore, this measure shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage.


