

**RESOLUTION NO. 12-2017**

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE A CONTROLLED VEHICLE REQUEST THROUGH THE OHIO LAW ENFORCEMENT SUPPORT OFFICE.

WHEREAS, the Department of Police has requested an armored vehicle for tactical operations; and

WHEREAS, currently the Department of Police utilizes tactical armored vehicles from West Chester Township or Warren County resulting in a wait time; and

WHEREAS, the execution of the within described request will place the City of Monroe on the list for an armored Humvee and Mine Resistant Armored Personnel vehicle.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MONROE, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:





Subject: Controlled Property, Tactical Vehicle Justification

1. The Monroe Police Department has 30 full time sworn officers and 1 part time sworn officer.
2. The Monroe Police Department will be utilizing the UAH for SWAT operations, critical incidents, active shooter situations, counterdrug, hostage rescue and natural disaster rescues.
3. The UAH will be stored maintained and operated by the Monroe Police Department. The Monroe Police Department will assist neighboring communities with the UAH, as we have a mutual aid agreement, but will only be operated by Monroe Police personnel.
4. The City of Monroe is located within a High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area, along I-75 in Warren County.
5. The Monroe Police Department is involved by mutual aid agreement with Warren County Sheriff's Office for a drug task force.
6. The current population for the City of Monroe is approximately 13,500 residents, with an elevated population near 50,000 on the weekends due to retail establishments.
7. The UAH will be stored in our City Services building. The building is a metal construction warehouse inside a secure fence. The building is approximately 10,000 square feet and climate controlled.
8. The Monroe Police Department will use the military training plan and safety standards to build our plans and standards. The Monroe Police Department will have bi-monthly trainings on the operation, protocols, technical training and scenario based training. Record keeping requirements and training will be performed quarterly.
9. Yes. The Monroe Police Department is currently in possession of 5 Colt M16 rifles and 5 Remington 1911 pistols.
10. The Monroe is requesting acquisition of one (1) M1151 UAH (Up Armored Humvee).


11. No request or grant has been approved or denied by any federal agency in the past 3 years.
12. The MRAP will be maintained with our vehicle maintenance budget. Our annual budget for maintenance is \$120,000. Last year we had \$43,900 left in our budget at the end of the year.
13. The Monroe Police Department has approval of the City Manager, Mr. William Brock.
14. The Monroe Police Department has NOT been found to be in violation of a Federal civil rights statute or programmatic term in the past three years.
15. The requested resource is not an aircraft.
