

EMERGENCY RESOLUTION NO. 22-2019

A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING APPRECIATION TO POLICE SERGEANT ERIC WALTON FOR HIS YEARS OF SERVICE TO THE CITY OF MONROE AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Sergeant Walton began his career with the City of Monroe as a Police Cadet in 1991; thereafter, he was appointed as a part time police officer in 1993, a full time police officer in 1995, and sergeant in 2014; and

WHEREAS, Sergeant Walton served as an advisor to and assisted with the start of the first Monroe Police Department Explorer Post, began the first annual Touch-A-Truck event and Police Chaplain Program; and

WHEREAS, Sergeant Walton also served as a Field Training Officer, Field Training Officer Coordinator, Community Service Officer, Animal Control Officer, and Coordinator of the Police Chaplain Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MONROE, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

SECTION 1: Council hereby expresses its appreciation for the 28 years of service and dedication Sergeant Walton has given to this community prior to his retirement of June 1, 2019.

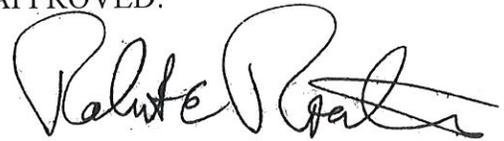
